The manufacturing sector in Welland boasts a rich history, and the city has consistently adapted to the dynamic landscape of advanced manufacturing. As one of Welland's primary employment sectors, featuring over 48 businesses and engaging over 2,500 individuals, the city remains a hub for diverse manufacturers, constantly embracing new entrants.


In 2016, Welland secured a significant addition to its manufacturing landscape when GE, now INNIO, opted to establish a new plant. This facility specializes in the production of large-scale gas engines and various components, providing employment opportunities for approximately 250 individuals. Notably, the plant is constructed based on the innovative brilliant factory concept, incorporating sensor-embedded machines connected to the Industrial Internet, enhancing efficiency and productivity.

Adding to the city's manufacturing prowess, the establishment of Linamar's cutting-edge giga casting factory marks a significant milestone for Welland. This transformative venture has been made possible through the support of the Gateway Community Improvement Program. Linamar, a renowned advanced manufacturing company, has chosen Welland as the home for its state-of-the-art 300,000-square-foot facility. This facility will play a pivotal role in producing crucial structural components for electric vehicles, contributing to the ongoing evolution of automotive technology.

In tandem with Linamar's venture, Upper Canada Railway Service (UCRS) has successfully concluded the construction of a state-of-theart 20,000 square foot manufacturing facility within the City of Welland's Enterprise Industrial subdivision. Renowned for its commitment to first-class quality, UCRS stands as a leading manufacturer and supplier specializing in a diverse range of assembly components and spare parts for locomotives, freight cars, and passenger coaches. UCRS's comprehensive services encompass equipment repairs, technical support, training, as well as project management and consulting for overhauls.

As Welland continues to attract and celebrate new success stories, it stands as a dynamic and evolving manufacturing hub, ready to shape the future of industrial innovation.
